

About the Circumcision Helpdesk™

The Circumcision Helpdesk™ is a not-for-profit publisher of accurate, medically approved, information about male circumcision and its benefits in terms of health, sexual wellbeing and self-image. It was established (under a different name) in the 1970s. We are consulted by individuals, doctors, and social services departments seeking to find out more about male circumcision and where they can get it performed for themselves or their sons, wards or patients. Our range of publications includes guidance booklets for those considering circumcision for themselves or their sons, a leaflet answering some of the questions teenagers and young people have about the operation, a leaflet for parents to give to their 7-10 year old sons to explain circumcision, and guides to preparing for, and the after-care of, a circumcision.

We work closely with Inter-Circ: The International Circumcision Forum (<http://groups.io/g/inter-circ>), with whom many booklets are co-produced. We also act as distributors for leaflets produced by an international consortium of practising doctors, researchers and renowned academics; which identify and quantify the proven benefits and minimal risks of circumcision both for infants and for adult men or teens. Additionally, some leaflets have been written by independent authors. All copyright holders have given permission for their contents to be reproduced and distributed by us.

To assist those who have decided upon a circumcision for themselves or their sons we maintain lists of doctors, clinics, etc whom they can approach for the operation. We welcome corrections and additions to these lists (which are not on-line but only available by e-mail).

A full list of available publications from all our sources appears inside this booklet. All the leaflets and booklets of up to 20 pages can be sent as PDFs by e-mail on request. Booklets of over about 20 pages are generally too large to send in their entirety but we can usually send relevant extracts, or they can be downloaded from the web site. We are constantly striving to increase the range of publications and the languages in which they are available.

The Helpdesk acts as the sponsor of a web site for the International Circumcision Information Reference Centre (ICIRC), an on-line resource set up to provide correct information and to counter the lies, half-truths and distortions with which anti-circumcision activists have flooded the web and social media. The Helpdesk and ICIRC believe that parents have a right and duty to positively exercise their choice as to whether or not to have an infant son circumcised. They should do this in the light of the growing body of available evidence regarding its medical benefits and minimal potential risks, as well as its social and religious significance within their own community.


Where parents choose not to circumcise their sons at birth we believe they have a duty to provide them with accurate information to make their own decision when they reach their teens. We hope that our publications will aid them in carrying out this duty.

We also believe that doctors have a duty to make circumcision readily and affordably available to those parents and men who request it, without judgementally questioning their motives. All of our own publications (except the List of Circumcisers) may be freely copied by doctors and clinics to give to their patients, provided this is without charge and our copyright and contact details remain unchanged.

Note that booklets and leaflets in languages other than English may be of an earlier edition as we don't have our own translators.

Many boys, especially those over 9, are quite capable of doing some of their own after-care and parents should encourage them to do so (under supervision) whenever possible.





By encouraging circumcision in boys, brothers, friends or their male siblings, women can help protect themselves, other women, and men in western countries, a nation has the legal right to advertise circumcision for the young. Although inflexible is the ideal time for a circumcision, many adult men and women can be encouraged to meet the criteria for medical, health, sexual, cultural, religious, cosmetic or personal reasons.



All About Being Circumcised

A leaflet for 7 – 10 year old boys

All about being circumcised

You may call your special boy part a baby for a while but the real name is a **penis**. Penises come in all shapes and sizes but when they are made to look different by a **little operation** called **circumcision** this would be the part which is **circumcised** and called which is short for **circumcision**, meaning **to cut**. Penis A is how you or your penis, C has been circumcised. All boys are born with a skin called the **foreskin**.




This leaflet, which has been checked for accuracy by our Medical Advisors, has been written for parents to give to their 7 - 10 year-old sons who are about to be circumcised; have just been circumcised; or who have asked what it is all about. It may also be suitable for boys just outside this age range.

It explains in child-friendly language why there appear to be two types of penis; the meaning of the word 'circumcision'; why circumcision is performed; some of the problems which can be associated with having a foreskin; and what will be done if they are about to be circumcised.

Additionally, parents may wish to read this for themselves to assist them in personally explaining circumcision to their sons.

The Best Age to Circumcise


There is much discussion about the best age for circumcision. This booklet, now in its 3rd edition, discusses some of the factors which may influence the decision.

An introductory Guide



However, since every country has its own legal system it is therefore virtually impossible for a basic publication such as this to cover every possible variation of the law on consent to medicine and surgery. *As it is written by a non-lawyer in laymans language, this booklet must be regarded as guidance only and not a definitive statement of the law.*

It sets out the general principles of legality of circumcision; the question of assault and consent; parental responsibility and doctors' rights. Examples of the position in some countries is given to provide a wider background to the topic.



Whilst circumcision is a procedure performed for serious reasons, there is no reason why it should not also feature in humour.



London Meet and Greet Service

An increasing number of people are coming to London to be circumcised by one or other of the recommended doctors at their clinics in the capital.

Many will have travelled a considerable distance (some even from abroad) for this and may be unfamiliar with London. Its sheer size, geography and complex transport system can easily confuse and overwhelm visitors.

The Meet and Greet Service has been designed to reduce their stress before the operation, and ensure they arrive on time, by providing an experienced life-long Londoner to be their guide from a suitable meeting point to the chosen clinic and back


again afterwards.

The Guide can also lend a London 'Oyster' travel card to get up to 40% off travel costs within London, as well as being essential on the cashless buses.

The service is completely free except for settling, at the end of the service, any amounts charged to the Oyster card whilst travelling in London.

Foreskin Problems

and the answer to them

Many parents, teens, adult men and even some doctors do not appreciate that a foreskin can cause significant problems at any stage of a male's life and ignore the adage that 'prevention is better than cure' which they usually apply to other medical problems.

Phimosis (tight foreskin) in infancy causes painful difficulty in urinating with serious risk to the bladder and kidneys.


In the teen or adult it prevents proper daily hygiene, resulting in obnoxious odours and may lead to painful infections.

The mature man may find phimosis or frenulum breve causing problems during intercourse, or masturbation, and even leading to cancer of the penis in old age.

This booklet aims to give an insight into these problems and the level of risk they pose. The answer to the problems is, of course, the simple external procedure of circumcision that can very easily be done at any age.



When performing a circumcision for a teen or adult is generally possible for the doctor to adjust three parameters, essentially independently, to achieve distinct aesthetic/visual differences. These adjustments are not so easily achieved when circumcising infants or young children as their penis is generally too small to be able to reliably make them. Similarly, the use of certain devices to assist in the circumcision can limit the ability to make adjustments.

The parameters that can be adjusted are: tightness, position of the cut, and retention or not of the frenulum. We consider each of these in the booklet, after looking at the composition of the foreskin.

Neonatal Circumcision Is Necessary

So you've just given birth to a son. Congratulations! Now you have an important decision to make. Should he be circumcised? Although the father is probably circumcised, are you being told that this act upon your infant son is barbaric, antiquated, unnecessary, painful and so on? Do you wonder that this decision has become fraught with confusion and fear. It is the fear of those who have caused this unjustified concern. As new parents you should be savouring the joy of your new arrival with as few additional worries as possible.

Neonatal circumcision is a prophylactic surgical operation that prevents serious disease. The current state of confusion over what had become a routine procedure in the United States is due in large part to the statements of two medical specialty groups, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology. In both cases, statements against neonatal circumcision were made by small groups within the organizations but were reinforced by the larger memberships of either society. This subject has been toxic to the American public and, on many of their well-meaning advisors, several abuse physicians have recognized that the statement of the pediatricians is based on "ignorance and admittedly inadequate information". The pro-circumcision cause has developed because groups of conservative, sensitive



Parental Rights, Parental Duties

There is a very strong suggestion these days, emanating particularly from the NACRC camp in America, that parents do not have the right to have their sons circumcised. We even hear of sons threatening to sue their parents for assault in having had the operation performed, although I have yet to hear of such a case being successful. I think therefore that the situation in which the parents of a newborn child find themselves vis-a-vis circumcision bears some analysis.

Parents have many decisions to make regarding the health, education and welfare of their infants and children; who clearly cannot take these decisions for themselves. One of these decisions is whether or not to have a son circumcised.

Whether this decision is for or against circumcision the author explains why it is effectively a decision for life. Although leaving the child uncircumcised gives a theoretical choice to the child to have a circumcision later, this proves illusory in most cases.

Principal Methods of Male Circumcision

A. Guided Freehand Methods

1. Shield and Knife/Scalpel

This is the method traditional used for a Jewish 'Brit'. The foreskin is pulled out in front of the glans, and a metal shield with a slit in it is laid over the foreskin immediately in front of the glans. The scalpel is run across the face of the shield to remove the foreskin. The glans is protected by the shield and the frenulum is not touched.

In a Brit the inner foreskin is then slit back to behind the glans and cut off in a non-rotational circumcision by this method the inner foreskin may be similarly removed, or may be left intact and just folded back. No stitches are used, the wound simply being bandaged up.

The tightness of the finished result depends on the operator's skill and whether or not the inner skin is also removed. Since the cut is always in front of the glans a relatively loose result is normal, particularly when the inner skin is not removed – the minimum amount of inner foreskin left being equal to the length of the glans. This method is normally only used on infants. For older children or adults the forceps Guided method would be used.

2. Forceps Guided

This is a close relative of the Shield and Knife method for older children and adults. The foreskin is pulled out in front of the glans and a pair of insect locking forceps is clamped across it, parallel to the coronal ridge of the glans and immediately behind the glans. The scalpel is run across the base of the forceps, further from the glans to remove the foreskin. The glans is protected by the forceps. This method does not cut the frenulum but it can be removed before or after the circumcision if desired.

Principal Methods of Male Circumcision

This leaflet describes some of the more common methods of circumcision and the type of result one might typically expect from each method.

The methods covered are divided into five main groups:

Guided Freehand - 'Shield and Knife', 'Forceps Guided' and Mogen Clamp methods.




